About the venue: Oude Vismijn (Old Fishmine)

Rekelingestraat 5, Ghent, Belgium

Situated at the confluence of the Lieve and the Leie rivers in the heart of Ghent, this historic site has been hustling since the late Middle Ages, serving as a hub for fishmongers until the 1960s. Today, behind the monumental entrance gate on Sint-Veerleplein, you will find a revitalized complex housing various event spaces. Boasting four rooms, a pontoon, terrace, and spacious courtyard, this completely renovated venue offers a blend of historic charm and modern amenities.

The Market, featuring ample daylight, an open roof truss, and atmospheric lighting, serves as the multifunctional room for the RTRS conference. Meanwhile, **De Eau'rangerie** will host lunch and coffee breaks.

»» How to get to Oude Vismijn?

From Brussels

Depart from Brussels:

- Board a train at Brussels Central Station (Bruxelles-Central) or Brussels Midi Station (Bruxelles-Midi).

Train options:

- **IC (InterCity) Trains:** Take an IC train heading towards Ghent (Gent). The journey takes approximately 30-40 minutes.
- **S (S-Bahn) Trains:** Alternatively, you can take an S train, which also connects Brussels to Ghent.

Arrival at Ghent:

- Disembark at Ghent St. Peter's Station (Gent-Sint-Pieters).



» How to get to Oude Vismijn?

From the Gent-Sint-Pieters train station

The Oude Vismijn is a 12-minute by car from Gent-Sint-Pieters train station, which offers many connections from all European countries.

Walking: It's about a 15-20 minute walk from the station to Oude Vismijn.

By bus: Bus lines 3, 5, and 9 also head towards the city center. Disembark at "Korenmarkt."

By De Lijn trams: Take the trams P4 Gent Fratersplein in perron 6 until Gent Brugse Port station. Then walk 750 metros through Burgstraat street.

Contactless payment on the trams is possible with your debit card, or smartphone. You just have to hold your card or device in front of the white terminal.

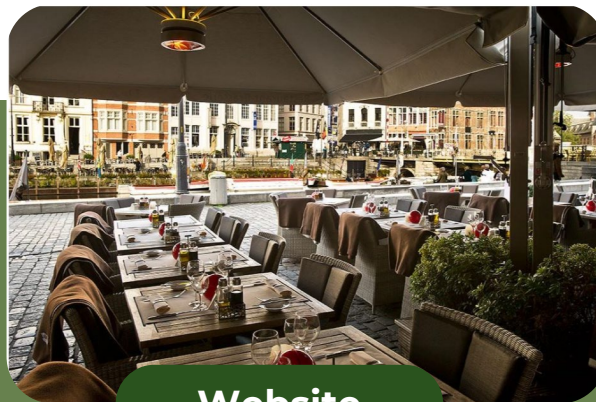

Sint-Michielsbrug
(St Michael's Bridge)

Gravensteen Castle

Sint-Veerleplein 11



- A medieval castle dating back to the 12th century.
- Features a moat, turrets, and a dungeon.
- Offers panoramic views of the city from its ramparts.
- Part of the UNESCO World Heritage site listing as a significant historical landmark.

Belfry of Ghent
